COMMISSION OF INQUIRY INTO POLICE CONDUCT

Implementation of recommendations by the Ministry of Justice and the Police Complaints Authority as at June 2007

1. The Commission of Inquiry into Police Conduct (the Commission) was established in February 2004 following publication of allegations suggesting that Police officers might have deliberately undermined or mishandled investigations into complaints of sexual assault that had been made against other officers.

3. The Commission made 60 recommendations in total. Of those recommendations, 12 are to be implemented by the Ministry of Justice and the Police Complaints Authority.
